- Transcripts of qualifications obtained prior to the current year and evidence of relevant work experience must be submitted with the application form. If transcripts are not available at the time of application, they should be forwarded to TUS immediately upon availability.

Immigration Process:

All visas are the sole responsibility of the applicant and delays in the issuing of a visa to study in Ireland may result in a student being asked to defer their place until the following academic year. Please be advised that fees must be paid in full before you receive a full offer letter. It is required to submit with visa application. Note that we may share your details with the Immigration Service Delivery (ISD) <https://www.irishimmigration.ie/>, in order to facilitate the visa application process.
